YUSHAN FORUM

The Yushan Forum: Asian Dialogue for Innovation and Progress, launched in 2017, is a platform for Asian regional dialogue initiated by Taiwan with the purpose of expanding multifaceted opportunities for cooperation and facilitating the exchange of ideas, talent, technologies, and social initiatives. The Forum, which also seeks to deepen Taiwan's partnerships with its New Southbound Policy partner countries, is attended by government and industry leaders, thinkers, innovators, and young talents from across Asia and other likeminded countries.

With the World Health Organization (WHO) ending the global emergency status for COVID-19 on May 5, 2023, the world is now eager to move on. In the wake of the challenges and opportunities brought by the pandemic, Asian leaders across all sectors are redrafting their roadmaps for the future. Echoing these developments, the 2023 Yushan Forum's theme is "Start a New Blueprint for Asian Development." Focusing on regional prosperity and stability, the 2023 edition of Yushan Forum will spotlight Taiwan's initiatives under the New Southbound Policy (NSP), which has been at the core of Taiwan's Indo-Pacific strategy since its launch in 2016 by President Tsai Ing-wen. In particular, it will highlight the NSP's accomplishments in the public, private, and civil society sectors. The forum will be a gathering of policymakers and prominent leaders from Taiwan, NSP partner countries, likeminded countries, and other countries in the Indo-Pacific region to discuss pragmatic blueprints for fostering inclusive and resilient growth in post-pandemic Asia.

Through advancing public-privatepeople partnerships (P-P-P-P), Taiwan's NSP has witnessed fruitful accomplishments in the past seven years, which have been recognized by partners and like-minded countries. PPPP refers to partnerships formed between the public sector, private sector, and people (civil society). The 2023 Yushan Forum will review the implementation and outcomes of these P-P-P, celebrate the milestones accumulated over the seven years of promoting the NSP, and explore how this partnership model can be advanced to play a bigger, more crucial, and more constructive role in the post-pandemic era.

TAIWAN-ASIA EXCHANGE FOUNDATION

Founded in 2018, the Taiwan-Asia Exchange Foundation (TAEF) is the first policy-oriented think tank in Taiwan focusing on Southeast Asian and South Asian affairs and facilitating Taiwan's New Southbound Policy (NSP). In the spirit of the NSP, the goal of the TAEF is to promote comprehensive ties between Taiwan and the 10 ASEAN and 6 South Asian countries, as well as Australia and New Zealand through cooperation and exchanges in five major fields—think tanks, nongovernmental organizations (NGOs), young leaders, regional resilience, and cultural affairs—to consolidate a sense of regional community in Asia and establish long-term multifaceted partnerships.

TAEF is devoted to building new mechanisms for regional cooperation between Taiwan and partner countries in Asia. Our goal is to cultivate policy blueprints for Taiwan, ASEAN, and South Asian countries through frequent regional dialogues, while also highlighting Taiwan's commitment and contributions toward regional development through concrete initiatives for cooperation. In addition, the TAEF hosts various international forums and conferences including its annual signature event—Yushan Forum: Asian Dialogue for Innovation and Progress-with the aim of strengthening ties with NSP partner countries and societies, while also inviting other like-minded countries to participate in regional dialogues and collaborations.

The New Southbound Policy is at the center of Taiwan's own Indo-Pacific strategy.

Dr. Tsai Ing-wen is the 15th President of the Republic of China (Taiwan).

Born in 1956 in Taipei City, Tsai Ing-wen traces her family roots to Fangshan Township of Pingtung County in southern Taiwan.

Dr. Tsai began her tenure as a part of Taiwan's trade negotiation delegation in the late 1980s. By 1990, Taiwan began working on the bid to join the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT), eventually gaining admission to the World Trade Organization (WTO) in 2002. She was on the front lines of the process during key negotiations in her capacity as Chief Legal Advisor (1992-2000).

In the late 1990s, cross-strait relations experienced several changes. Dr. Tsai served successively as Senior Adviser to the Mainland Affairs Council (1994-1998), Senior Adviser to the National Security Council (1999-2000), and Chairperson of the Mainland Affairs Council (2000-2004), devoting her efforts to the development of cross-strait relations.

Dr. Tsai joined the Democratic Progressive Party (DPP) in 2004 and became a DPP legislator at-large (2005-2006). She was then appointed to serve as vice premier (2006-2007).

Dr. Tsai represented the DPP in Taiwan's 13th-term presidential election in 2012, becoming Taiwan's first female presidential candidate. She ran again as the DPP candidate in 2016, and was elected as the nation's 14th-term president. The first female head of state in Taiwan's history, Dr. Tsai is also the first female head of state in Asia who was not born into a political family. Dr. Tsai represented the DPP in the nation's 15th-term presidential election in 2020 and was successfully re-elected with over 8.17 million votes, the highest total in Taiwan's history.

Dr. Tsai obtained a Ph.D. in Law from the London School of Economics and Political Science in 1984, specializing in international trade law.

Taiwan will continue to cooperate with like-minded countries and work toward participation in CPTPP and the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework, so that we can contribute to global economic revitalization, as global industry chains are restructured and become more resilient.

Dr. Lai Ching-te is the 15th Vice President of the Republic of China (Taiwan).

Dr. Lai Ching-te was born in 1959 in New Taipei City's Wanli District. He received his B.S. from National Taiwan University's Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, completed the Post-Bachelor Program in Medical Science at National Cheng Kung University, and then obtained a Master of Public Health degree from Harvard University.

In 1998, Dr. Lai was elected to the Legislative Yuan representing Tainan City. Leveraging his medical expertise, he played a dynamic role in the Social Welfare and Environmental Hygiene Committee while addressing over 100,000 local issues. He chaired the legislature's bipartisan Health, Welfare and Environment Foundation and was also part of a lobby group promoting Taiwan's World Health Organization (WHO) membership. During his four consecutive terms (1999-2010), Dr. Lai was nominated as the "Best Legislator" by Citizen Congress Watch.

In 2010, Dr. Lai was elected as the mayor of Tainan City, and was later reelected in 2014, winning by a wide margin of 72% of the vote. As mayor from 2010 to 2017, Dr. Lai also actively promoted city diplomacy, working closely with the Japanese, National Diet, and the private sectors to promote exchanges and sister-city agreements, enhancing substantive ties in culture, tourism, sports, agriculture, and disaster relief.

Taking on new leadership responsibilities in troubling times, Dr. Lai served as Taiwan's premier from 2017 to 2019. In November 2019, Dr. Lai accepted President Tsai Ing-wen's invitation to be her vice-presidential running mate in the following year's election, helping President Tsai win re-election and the DPP retain a legislative majority.



H.E. Russ Joseph Kun

President, Republic of Nauru

Taiwan has the potential to play a significant role in shaping a new blueprint for Asian development due to its unique strengths and contributions.

H.E. Russ Joseph Kun is a Nauruan politician, who became the President of Nauru, after being elected in the Presidential election on 28th September 2022.

During the first parliament sitting that followed the 2022 general election, Hon. Kun was the sole nominee, unopposed for President of Nauru. This is a remarkable achievement and Hon. Kun was sworn in as President of Nauru along with his Cabinet Ministers on 29 September 2022. His portfolios include Public Service, Foreign Affairs and Trade, Nauru Police Force, National Emergency Services, Internal Affairs, Women and Social Development Affairs, People Living with Disabilities, Nauru Air Corporation, Port Authority, Nauru Shipping Line and Nauru Tourism Corporation.

HE. Hon.Kun has served as a Member of Parliament for Ubenide since 2013.

HE. Hon. Kun was first elected to the Parliament of Nauru in 2013, as one of the four members from the Ubenide Constituency. He was re-elected in 2016, 2019, and 2022. In 2019, Hon. Kun was Deputy Minister for Finance, Nauru Ports, Tourism, and National Heritage and Museum. In 2016, Hon. Kun was Assistant Minister for Finance and Commerce, Industry, and Environment.

Hon. Kun served as Chair of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on the Leadership Code during the year 2015-2016. He led efforts to develop a code of ethics for the Parliament of Nauru. Hon.Kun is a member of the Global Organization of Parliamentarians Against Corruption (GOPAC).

Prior to entering Parliament, Hon. Kun was the Permanent Secretary of the Department of Commerce, Industry, and Environment from 2006 to 2013 and was responsible for overseeing the Agriculture, Business Development, and Environment Divisions. He also held the position of Director of Commerce and Trade from 2002 to 2006, overseeing Trade Policies and being responsible for business development at the grassroots level.



The Hon. Scott Morrison MP

Member of the House of Representatives, Australia The 30th Australian Prime Minister

It is impossible to address the challenges of security and prosperity in the Indo-Pacific without confronting the status and future of Taiwan.

Scott Morrison served as Prime Minister of Australia from 2018 to 2022.

As Prime Minister, Mr. Morrison successfully led Australia through the global COVID 19 pandemic, achieving one of the world's most effective public health and economic responses.

Mr. Morrison was also the architect and founder of the AUKUS trilateral defense agreement between Australia, the UK and the US. He was a founding member of the Quad Leaders dialogue and completed numerous other diplomatic, trade and defense agreements, especially in the Indo-Pacific.

Domestically, Mr. Morrison stewarded the Australian economy to its lowest unemployment rate in almost 50 years, restored the federal budget to a structural surplus, and ensured Australia remained one of only nine countries in the world to maintain a AAA credit rating from all major international credit rating agencies.

Prior to becoming Prime Minister, Mr. Morrison served as a Cabinet Minister for five years, including as Federal Treasurer, Minister for Social Services, and Minister for Immigration and Border Protection. Mr Morrison also served for eight years respectively on Australia's National Security Committee and Expenditure Review Committee. Mr Morrison was first elected to Parliament in 2007, as the Member for Cook, in southern Sydney.

Mr. Morrison is a Chief Commander of the United States Legion of Merit. He was also awarded the Jerusalem Prize by the World Zionist Council and the inaugural Grotius Prize for International Relations by UK Policy Exchange. He is a member of the Strategic Advisory Board of the International Democratic Union, the Center for a New American Security and the Hudson Institute China Center.

Mr. Morrison is married to Jenny, they have two teenage daughters and live in Sydney, Australia.



Kelly Craft

The 30th US Permanent Representative to the UN, USA

Taiwan is a trusted and valued partner for the United States in the region and beyond. Its vibrant democracy is a powerful symbol for people everywhere. I look forward to discussing Taiwan's role on the global stage in the Yushan Forum.

Ambassador Kelly Craft is an American businesswoman, political donor, philanthropist, politician, and former diplomat who served as the $30^{\rm th}$ United States Ambassador to the United Nations from 2019 to 2021.

She previously served as the 31st US Ambassador to Canada from 2017 to 2019, the first woman to hold the office. Amb. Craft earlier was appointed by President George W. Bush as a U.S. alternate delegate to the UN in 2007, where her focus included U.S. engagement in Africa.

Ambassador Craft heads Kelly G. Knight LLC, a business advisory firm based in Lexington, Kentucky, and serves on the advisory board of the Canadian American Business Council. In 2015, Ambassador Craft and Joe Craft, her husband, co-founded the Craft Academy for Excellence in Science and Mathematics at Kentucky's Morehead State University, a special program for academically exceptional high school students.



Matt Murray

Our extensive economic cooperation with Taiwan inside and outside of APEC spans a range of issues including women's economic participation, energy security and resilience, and the digital economy. Taiwan can leverage its expertise in these areas and global leadership in public health, advanced manufacturing, and other sectors to contribute to "starting a new blueprint for Asian development."

Ambassador Matt Murray serves as the U.S. Senior Official for the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC), where he coordinates the United States' active engagement and participation in APEC during the U.S. host year while also overseeing the Office of Economic Policy in the State Department's Bureau of East Asian and Pacific Affairs. Throughout his career at the State Department, Ambassador Murray has focused on fostering U.S. economic engagement with the Indo-Pacific region, including serving Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Trade Policy and Negotiations, Minister Counselor for Economic Affairs at the U.S. Embassy in Beijing, Counselor for Economic Affairs at the U.S. Embassy in Canberra, and Special Assistant in the Office of the Under Secretary for Economic Growth, Energy and Environment. He holds a master's degree from the U.S. Army War College and the University of Pittsburgh and a bachelor's degree from Washington College in Chestertown, Maryland.

Through close cooperation with countries that share common values of freedom, democracy, basic human rights, and the rule of law, Taiwan will be able to shape sustainable economic development in Asia and make active international contributions.

Keiji FURUYA (born 1952) is a Japanese politician in the Liberal Democracy Party (Japan), and a member of the House of Representatives in the Diet (national legislature). He is also the Chairman of the Japan-ROC Diet Members' Consultative Council, which has 260 members of parliament across party lines.

Keiji FURUYA served as the Chairman of the National Commission on Public Safety, the Minister of State for the Abduction Issue, the Minister in charge of Building National Resilience, and the Minister of State for Disaster Management. Keiji FURUYA also served as the Chairman of the Committee on Rules and Administration.

In recent years, Keiji FURUYA has led several delegations to visit Taiwan and openly said that Japan supports Taiwan to join the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP), and as an observer to the World Health Assembly (WHA).

Keiji FURUYA has also delivered a speech at the Yushan Forum in Taipei five times (2018-2022).



Hsin-Huang Michael Hsiao

Prof. H. H. Michael Hsiao is the Chairman of both Taiwan-Asia Exchange Foundation and the Center for Southeast Asian Studies at National Chengchi University.

He is also the Adjunct Research Fellow of the Institute of Sociology, Academia Sinica; Chair Professor of Hakka Studies, National Central University and Honorary Chair Professor of Southeast Asian Studies, National Chi Nan International University. Internationally, he is the Chairman of the Consortium of Southeast Asian Studies in Asia, Executive Committee Member of the Consortium of Global Hakka Studies. He served as National Policy Advisor to the President of Taiwan between 1996 and 2006 and is currently Senior Advisor to the President of Taiwan since 2016.

His areas of specialization include middle-class economic development, civil society and democratization in Asia, environmental movements, sustainability and risk society, and comparative Hakka studies in Taiwan and Southeast Asia.

From 2007 to 2008, he was the Representative of the Republic of China (Taiwan) to the United States as the head of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Representative Office in Washington, D.C. Prior to holding public offices, he was an academic political scientist, finishing his Ph.D. in political science in 1989 at Ohio State University, and served as a research fellow at the Institute of International Relations of National Chengchi University.

Embracing Taiwan as a member of Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership would not only ensure the economic security and supply-chain resilience of the Indo-Pacific region but also demonstrate the pact members' commitment to open markets, fair trade practices and democratic values.

Minister without Portfolio John Chen-Chung Deng plays a leading role in Taiwan's New Southbound Policy. As Trade Representative of the Office of Trade Negotiations, Executive Yuan, he has been instrumental in expanding Taiwan's economic ties with international partners. He has held a number of prominent positions in the government, including Minister of Economic Affairs (2014-2016), Minister without Portfolio, and Governor of Fujian Province (2014).

Minister Deng was also Deputy Secretary General of the National Security Council (2009-2014); Deputy Minister of the MOEA; Chief Representative of the Office of Trade Negotiations, MOEA; Deputy Representative of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Representative Office in the United States and Deputy Minister of the Mainland Affairs Council.

He holds a law degree from Soochow University and an LLM from George Washington University in the USA.



Chern-Chyi "C.C." Chen

Deputy Minister, Ministry of Economic Affairs, R.O.C. (Taiwan)

Through the horizontal collaboration, Taiwan will build a resilient supply chain with the New Southbound Policy countries, and support sustainable development in the region.

Mr. Chen was appointed as the Deputy Minister of Taiwan's Ministry of Economic Affairs (MOEA) in August 2020.

As the Deputy Minister, Mr. Chen's extensive portfolio covers trade policy and promotion, export controls, investment attraction and review, international cooperation, business registration and administration, Small and Medium Enterprise (SME) administration, Intellectual Property, Mines, Personnel, Statistics, Administrative Appeal Review, Legal Counsel, the Professional Training Center, the International Trade Commission, and Foreign Economic & Commercial Services.

Mr. Chen joined the Ministry of Economic Affairs (MOEA) in 1989 and has held multiple senior positions within the Ministry over the past 33 years.

He was formerly the Director General of the Bureau of Foreign Trade and also served at Taiwan's representative offices in Washington D.C., Geneva, Singapore and Brussels.

He was the Chief Counsel at the Office of Trade Negotiations and lead negotiator for services and legal affairs during bilateral trade and economic agreement negotiations with Singapore and with New Zealand as well as negotiations with Japan and mainland China. He also served as lead counsel for Taiwan in WTO dispute settlement cases.

Mr. Chen was born in Taipei in 1960. He holds a Master of Laws degree focused on economic administration and a Master of Comparative Law degree, obtained from George Washington University.

Major General Delfin N. Lorenzana became the 11th Chairman of the Bases Conversion and Development Authority (BCDA) when he was appointed on 7 July 2022.

Prior to his appointment as Chairman of the BCDA, MGen Lorenzana was the Secretary of National Defense from 2016 to 2022 where he played a prominent role in the successful counter-insurgency and anti-terrorist campaign of the Philippine Government. He likewise forged closer defense relations with neighboring countries such as Indonesia, Malaysia, Brunei, Japan, South Korea and Australia. He orchestrated and managed the successful resolution of the Marawi Siege and was designated martial law administrator of Mindanao. Professor Xiao-Xiong Zhang was born in Cambodia and moved to China in his early teens. He earned the Bachelor of Arts degree from the History Department of Jinan University before emigrating to Australia in 1983, where he studied modern dance at the Centre for Performing Arts (Adelaide) and started the career as a professional dancer.

Professor Zhnag has long experience in performing arts. He danced with the One Extra Company (Sydney) from 1985 to 1987, the Australian Dance Theatre (Adelaide) from 1987 to 1992, and Vis-a-Vis from 1994 to 1995. In 1992, Professor Zhang also performed in Jim Sharman's Shadow and Splendour, a joint production by the Royal Queensland Theatre Company and the State Theatre Company of South Australia.

Professor Zhang later moved to Taipei in 1996 and took up the position as the Associate Professor of the Dance College of the National Taipei University for the Arts (former NIA) and the teacher of modern dance for the Cloud Gate Dance Theatre. He also joined the Taipei Crossover Dance Company in the same year and toured to London, New York, Philadelphia, Miami, Hong Kong, Guangzhou, Beijing, and the Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival, during which time the Company had also presented his works.

In 2004, Professor Zhang joined the Taipei Chiang Kai-shek Memorial Hall National Theatre production, the Legend of Madame Tsai. He is also the leading character of Chang Tso-Chi's film Synapses (2019).



Huang Hsiu-Yi

Born in Yunlin County, Taiwan, Huang Hsiu-Yi is a director who was trained at the Graduate Institute of Studies in Documentary & Film Archiving. In addition to her film production work, which mainly focuses on issues surrounding women and rural Taiwan, she is also involved in organizing film festivals and promoting media literacy. She began focusing on the status of new immigrants to Taiwan while managing the 2011 New Immigrants Film Festival held by South Taiwan Film Association. In 2012, she served as producer on new-immigrant director Nguyen Kim Hong's (Vietnamese) filming of Out/Marriage. In 2015, with the help of financial assistance from the Wanderer Program, a subsidy provided by Cloud Gate Culture and Arts Foundation, she traced the Mekong River through Thailand, Laos, Cambodia and Vietnam, filming the interaction between local people and the river, as well as the rise and transformation of ASEAN countries.

Her latest work Diamond Marine World records the life and conflicts of a Taiwanese working in Myanmar and presents how people with different values struggle to get rich. This work won the Grand Prize and Best Documentary in Taipei Film Festival 2023.


