Yushan Forum: The 2025 Edition

Since its founding in 2017, the Yushan Forum: Asian Dialogue for Innovation and Progress has served as a core platform for Asian regional discussion on Taiwan's implementation of the New Southbound Policy (NSP). The forum, hosted by the Taiwan-Asia Exchange Foundation (TAEF), seeks to increase exchange of ideas, talent, technologies and social initiatives between Taiwan and NSP partner countries, and to foster multilateral cooperation between Asian nations, as well as Australia and New Zealand. To achieve this, the forum brings together important figures in both the public and private sectors of like-minded countries across Asia and the Pacific, including political leaders, policy makers, heads of industry and innovative professionals, providing a space to discuss crucial topics such as regional stability, collective economic growth, and disaster prevention and aid through the framework of the NSP.

In recent years, geopolitical relations across the globe have grown in complexity and nuance, requiring continuous adaptation. In view of this, this year's Yushan Forum is themed "New Southbound Policy+: Taiwan, the Indo-Pacific, and a New World," which highlights a fresh position and vision for Taiwan in the evolving international situation. It will also focus on the introduction of the New Southbound Policy+ (NSP+), the most recent evolution of Taiwan's flagship policy for strengthening relations with its neighbors and other like-minded countries, and expanding the interconnectivity of the Indo-Pacific region. The NSP+ represents the dedication of President Lai Ching-te to the continuation of

the NSP and a vision for Taiwan greeting a new world and the world greeting a new Taiwan. Under the integrated diplomacy approach promoted by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA), Taiwan's government agencies, corporations, and civil society organizations are coordinating to integrate values-based diplomacy. alliance-based diplomacy, and economic and trade diplomacy to realize the goal of Taiwan becoming a global economic powerhouse on which the sun never sets. The 8th Yushan Forum is set to introduce how the NSP+ could leverage these public-private-people partnerships (P-P-P-P) and include new features, such as the NSP+ Corridors, to further synergize the policy's various areas of focus led by both government and non-government efforts.

Taiwan is steadily demonstrating its importance to international networks and its determination to contribute to the world. Connections between Taiwan, the Indo-Pacific, and the rest of the world are expanding in all spheres. The 8th Yushan Forum will explore concrete proposals that leverage the NSP+ to further consolidate the strengths of partners and deepen multilateral cooperation. By fostering greater opportunities for international engagement and cooperation, the forum aspires to present Taiwan to the world as an active and indispensable partner that contributes to regional and global prosperity.

Founded in 2018, the Taiwan-Asia Exchange Foundation (TAEF) is Taiwan's first policy-oriented think tank dedicated to Southeast Asian and South Asian affairs, and the advocacy of the New Southbound Policy (NSP).

Hsin-Huang Michael Hsiao is the Chairman of Taiwan-Asia Exchange Foundation; Adjunct Research Fellow/Professor of Institute of Sociology, Academia Sinica; Chair Professor of Hakka Studies, National Central University; and Senior Advisor to the President of Taiwan since 2016. His current research areas include: middle class, civil society and democracy in Asia, social transition to de-carbonized society in Taiwan and comparative Hakka studies in Taiwan and Southeast Asia. His most recent book publications are: The Diverse Manifestations of Hakka Ethnicity in Southeast Asia (co-editor, 2024); Southeast Asia, Ethnic Chinese Hakka, and Taiwan's New Residents (co-editor, 2024); Sociology of Decarbonization: The Public Opinion and Challenges of Taiwan's Net-Zero Transition (co-author, 2024); Writing Taiwan's Third Sector History (co-editor, 2023); Three Divides: Transformation of Hakka Ethnic Politics in Taiwan (co-author, 2022); The Many Faces of Taiwan's Cultural Diplomacy (co-editor, 2022); The Ethnic Relations of Hakka Belts in Taiwan and Malaysia (co-editor, 2022).



H.E. Dr. LAI Ching-te

President, R.O.C. (Taiwan)

H.E. Dr. Lai Ching-te is the 16th President of the Republic of China (Taiwan).

President Lai Ching-te was born in 1959 in New Taipei City's Wanli District. He received his B.S. from National Taiwan University's Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, completed the Post-Bachelor Program in Medical Science at National Cheng Kung University, and then obtained a Master of Public Health degree from Harvard University.

In 1998, President Lai was elected to the Legislative Yuan representing Tainan City. Leveraging his medical expertise, he played a dynamic role in the Social Welfare and Environ-mental Hygiene Committee while addressing over 100,000 local issues. He chaired the legislature's bipartisan Health, Welfare and Environment Foundation and was also part of a lobby group promoting Taiwan's World Health Organization (WHO) membership. During his four consecutive terms (1999 to 2010), President Lai was nominated as the "Best Legislator" by Citizen Congress Watch.

In 2010, President Lai was elected as the mayor of Tainan City, and was later reelected in 2014, winning by a wide margin of 72% of the vote. As mayor from 2010 to 2017, President Lai also actively promoted city diplomacy, working closely with the Japanese, National Diet, and the private sectors to promote exchanges and sister-city agreements, enhancing substantive ties in culture, tourism, sports, agriculture, and disaster relief.

Taking on new leadership responsibilities in troubling times, President Lai served as Taiwan's premier from 2017 to 2019, and served as the 15th-term vice president from 2020 to 2024. In January 2023, President Lai began concurrently serving as DPP chairperson. In the same year, he was announced as the DPP candidate for Taiwan's 16th-term presidential election, and was successfully elected in January 2024.



Hon. Anders Fogh RASMUSSEN

Anders Fogh Rasmussen has been at the centre of European and global politics for over three decades as a leading Danish parliamentarian, Danish Minister of Economic Affairs, Prime Minister of Denmark and, last but not least, as Secretary General of NATO. Upon leaving NATO, Mr. Rasmussen founded his strategic advisory firm "Rasmussen Global," which provides geopolitical and strategic consulting services.

He is also the Chairman of the Alliance of Democracies Foundation, a non-profit organisation for the advancement of democracy and free markets across the globe.

Janez Janša (born 17 September 1958) is a Slovenian politician who served three times as a prime minister of Slovenia, a position he had held from 2004 to 2008, from 2012 to 2013, and from 2020 to 2022. Since 1993, Janša has led the Slovenian Democratic Party, which has emerged as the pre-eminent Slovenian conservative party.

Janša served as Minister of Defense from 1990 to 1994, a post he had also held during the Slovenian War of Independence. Janša served as prime minister from 2004 to 2008, and again became prime minister in 2012, following an early election in December 2011. Despite his party winning a plurality of votes in the 2018 Slovenian parliamentary election, Janša was initially passed over as a prime minister. After spending years in opposition, Janša was selected as prime minister-designate in March 2020 following the resignation of Prime Minister Marjan Šarec. His third term as a prime minister ended on 13 May 2022.

Keiji FURUYA (born 1952) is a Japanese politician in the Liberal Democracy Party (Japan), and a member of the House of Representatives in the Diet (National Legislature). He is also the Chairman of the Japan-ROC Diet Members' Consultative Council, which has 240 members of parliament across party lines. Keiji FURUYA served as the Chairman of the National Commission on Public Safety, the Minister of State for the Abduction Issue, the Minister in charge of Building National Resilience, and the Minister of State for Disaster Management. Keiji FURUYA also served as the Chairman for the Committee on Rules and Administration. In recent years, Keiji FURUYA has led several delegations to visit Taiwan and openly said that Japan supports Taiwan to join the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP), and as an observer to the World Health Assembly (WHA).

Keiji FURUYA has also delivered opening remarks for the Yushan Forum in Taiwan for six consecutive year.



H.E. Raymond F. GREENE

Director, American Institute in Taiwan (AIT)

Raymond F. Greene assumed duties as the Director of the American Institute in Taiwan (AIT) on July 8, 2024. Prior to this assignment, he served as the Deputy Chief of Mission at the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo, Japan. Mr. Greene is a member of the State Department's Senior Foreign Service with the personal rank of Minister-Counselor and has spent his entire 28-year career advancing U.S. diplomatic, economic, and security engagement with the Indo-Pacific region. In Washington, Mr. Greene was Director for Japan and East Asian Economic Affairs at the National Security Council and Director of the Office of Economic Policy in the State Department's Bureau of East Asian and Pacific Affairs. In the latter capacity, Mr. Greene was elected as Chair of the Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) forum's Economic Committee.

Overseas, Mr. Greene served as U.S. Consul General in Chengdu, China, Okinawa, Japan and as the Deputy Director at AIT. Earlier assignments included Chief of the Political-Military Affairs Unit at the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo, Deputy Chief of the Political Section at AIT Taipei, and as a political officer in Tokyo and Manila. Mr. Greene was the first Baker-Kato Diplomatic Exchange Fellow at the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Tokyo. He also was assigned as a State Department Faculty Advisor at the U.S. Army War College in Carlisle, Pennsylvania.

Mr. Greene holds a B.A. (Government/Japanese) and M.P.M. (International Security and Economic Policy) from the University of Maryland, College Park. He is the recipient of the Secretary of Defense Meritorious Civilian Service Medal, the Ryozo Kato Award for Advancing the U.S.-Japan Alliance, the Friendship Medal of Diplomacy (Taiwan), and several state Department Superior and Meritorious Honor Awards. Before joining the State Department, Mr. Greene was a researcher at the Peterson Institute for International Economics in Washington, DC and spent a year in Yokohama on the Japan Exchange and Teaching (JET) program. Mr. Greene speaks Japanese and Mandarin Chinese.

Minister, National Development Council (NDC), R.O.C. (Taiwan)

Hon. Chin-Ching Liu has served as the Minister of the National Development Council (NDC) of Taiwan since May 20, 2024, focusing on advancing Taiwan's economic development and international cooperation.

Minister Liu holds a Bachelor's degree in Applied Mathematics from Chung Yuan University and an MBA from National Taiwan University. With extensive experience in corporate management and consulting, he has held key positions such as SCM Consultant Leader at IBM Greater China, General Manager of IBM Global Business Service, Partner & Vice Chairman at PwC Consulting, and Chairman of PwC Business Consultant Service in Taiwan. Additionally, he has served as a Professor-level Technical Expert at the Department of Accounting, National Chengchi University, Taiwan.

Since taking office, Minister Liu has actively promoted various policies, such as:

- The Bridge Project, fostering startup and enterprise collaboration between Taiwan and Japan;
- Talent recruitment in India, facilitating Taiwan-India AI industry talent exchanges;
- The establishment of a startup hub in Silicon Valley, strengthening Taiwan's connection with the global startup ecosystem;
- Deepening cooperation with Lithuania, enhancing development in semiconductors and industrial innovation.



Dr. Jia-Yush YEN

Professor Jia-Yush Yen received his B.S. degree from National Tsing-Hwa University, Taiwan in 1980, his M.S. degree from the University of Minnesota, USA in 1983, and his Ph.D. degree from University of California, Berkeley in 1989, all in mechanical engineering. He then joined the Mechanical Engineering faculty of National Taiwan University, where he served as the Department Chair, the Director of Tjing-Ling Industrial Research Institute, and the Dean of the College of Engineering until 2017. In 2021, Prof. Yen became a professor in the Department of Mechanical Engineering at the National Taiwan University of Science and Technology. He is also the President of the University.

Prof. Yen also served as the Chair of Taiwan's Automation Area for the Ministry of Science and Technologies. He was also the President of the Chinese Institute of Automation Engineers (CIAE), Taiwan, and the President of the Chinese Automatic Control Society, Taiwan. He also served in numerous academic positions, including the Director of the NTU Research and Development Center for Medical Devices, the NTU Research Center for Intelligent Machines. He is a fellow of the ASME, the CIAE, the Robotics Society of Taiwan, and the Chinese Society of Mechanical Engineering.

Dr. Yen received twice the Outstanding Research Award from the Ministry of Science and Technologies, Taiwan. He also received numerous compliments from the government for his public service. His research interests are in the areas of mechatronic systems, computer peripherals, and nano-manipulations.

Taiwan's Cyber Ambassador-at-Large

Audrey Tang, a TIME100 "Most Influential People in AI" honoree (2023), is Taiwan's Cyber Ambassador-at-Large and served as Taiwan's 1st digital minister and the world's 1st nonbinary cabinet minister (2016-2024).

Tang played a crucial role in shaping g0v (gov-zero), one of the most prominent civic tech movements worldwide. In 2014, she helped broadcast the demands of Sunflower Movement activists, and worked to resolve conflicts during a three-week occupation of Taiwan's Legislature. Tang became a reverse mentor to the minister in charge of digital participation, before holding the role in 2016.

Tang helped develop participatory democracy platforms such as vTaiwan and Join, bringing civic innovation into the public sector through initiatives like the Presidential Hackathon and Ideathon.

Other accomplishments for Tang include shaping Taiwan's internationally acclaimed COVID-19 response, as well as safeguarding the country's 2024 presidential and legislative elections from cyber interference.
